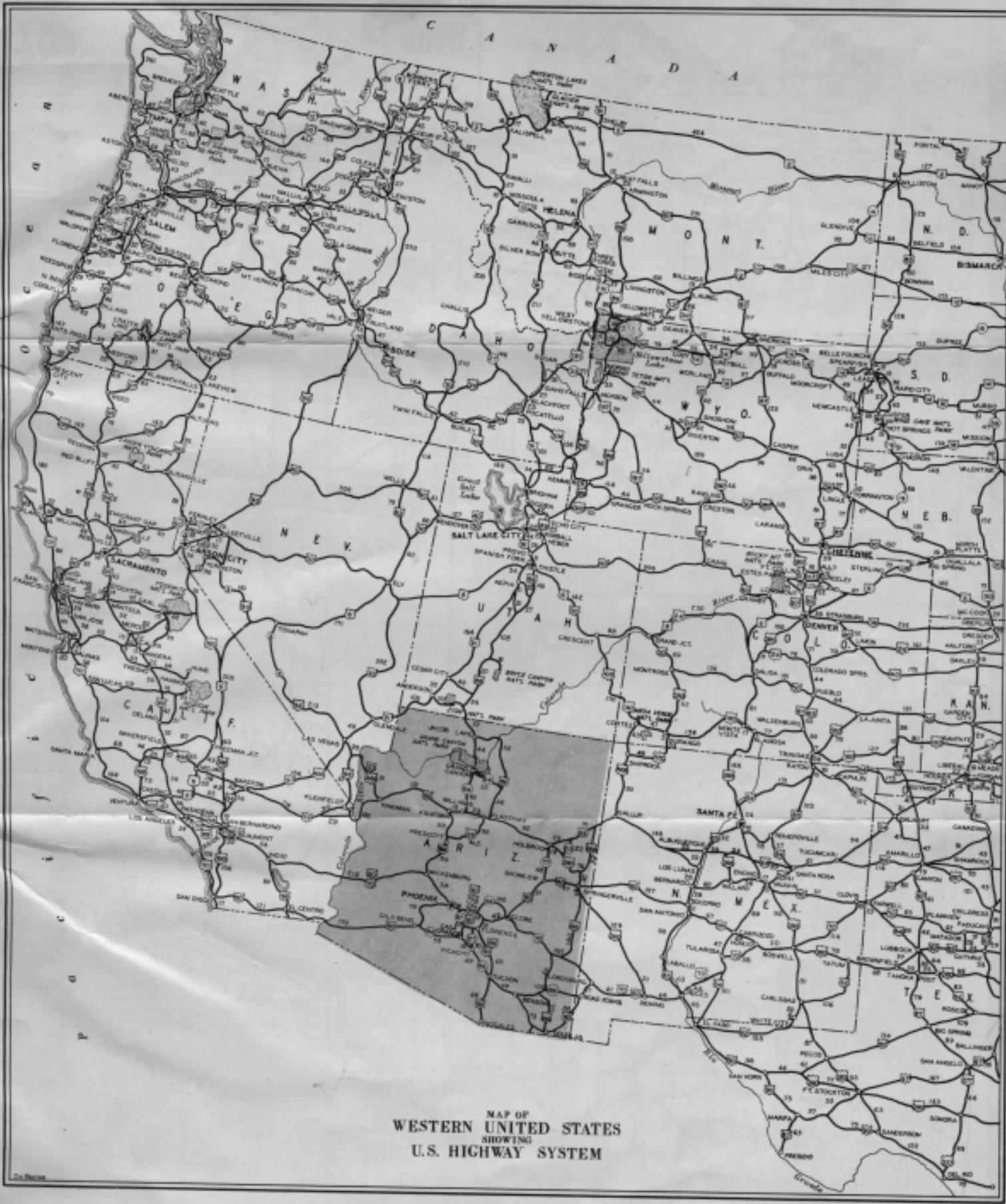

Motor Vehicle Regulations

VISITOR'S PERMIT

Non-resident cars may be operated within the State of Arizona for full period of time the home State registration is valid, without affecting registration, providing the owner registers within ten days of the time of arrival, and secures a no fee Visitor's Permit. These permits may be procured from any State Highway patrolman, or at any of the State Highway Checking Stations, also the main office of the Highway Patrol in Phoenix, Arizona.

OPERATOR'S LICENSE

Non-resident owners, from states not requiring operator's license, may operate their vehicles thirty days, before securing an operator's license. Valid licenses from other states are honored.

ACCIDENTS

Whenever the driver of a motor vehicle is involved in an accident where a person is injured, or there is any apparent property damage in excess of \$50.00, the driver must report to the Police Department if such accident occurred within the limits of the City, and if without the City limits, to the Sheriff or a Highway patrolman, on the forms furnished and approved by the Motor Vehicle Division.

SAFETY SUGGESTIONS

Have your operator's or Chauffeur's license in your immediate possession at all times while operating a motor vehicle.

Always give your driving your undivided attention.

Drive onto proper lane before turning right or left.

Always give proper arm signal before altering course of travel.

Drive on the right side of the centerline at all times, except when passing.

See that the road ahead is sufficiently clear to allow safe passage before attempting to overtake and pass another vehicle.

Give way to the right side of the road and do not increase speed when another vehicle operator signals by horn for right of way to overtake and pass.

Allow sufficient clearance for safety after passing another vehicle.

Park off of traveled portion of highway and NEVER park or stop on Bridges.

Luggage and other items must not be allowed to project beyond left fender line.

Always give aid in case of accident.

Lower headlight beam when approaching an oncoming car or following closely behind another.

Watch for and observe Stop signs, warning signs and traffic signals.

WATCH FOR AND OBSERVE:

All Speed signs.

School Zone, when school is in session and when children are going to and from school—15 M.P.H.
When passing a school bus loading or unloading children—15 M.P.H.

Business District—20 M.P.H.

Residence District—25 M.P.H.

At night and in bad weather Slow Down.
